Unfortunately, a record number of dogs and cats have been abandoned post-pandemic. It's a sad fact that people all over the country who bought and adopted pets to ride out the storm have discarded them now that it's over.

#### **Sweet Mothers and Babies Saved**





This happy girl and her eight babies were discovered in April after they were abandoned at a gas station in San Antonio. The people who rescued the little family took good care of them before bringing them to SARA. Smiley is a Pug mix, and the puppies will remain small.

**CATALINA** is a painfully shy dog whose life on the street had been horrible: people tried to poison her and threw rocks at her. It's no wonder she is still afraid of people. A local San Antonio rescue group set a trap to capture her, but she refused to go inside and had to be lassoed! She was pregnant and gave birth to fifteen puppies shortly after being taken to safety. All but two survived and were all adopted.

SARA staffer Heidi Wilson jumped into action and immediately drove to San Antonio on her day off to rescue the sweet, pregnant dog we named Peanut Butter.

She was infested with ticks and hookworms, so not surprisingly, her bloodwork showed she was severely anemic and would need time to grow strong and healthy before her pups were born. She was treated for parasites and started her on antibiotics and vitamins. She gave birth to six adorable, healthy brown puppies a week later!

It will be a few months before the babies and mom will be ready for their new homes.
